The safety training is essential as well as the communications training which helps the group on the ground be able to communicate with the operator at all times.

Due to the extreme environments these machinery work under, they are usually put under incredible strain on a regular basis. This means there are plenty of heavy equipment jobs available for the maintenance and repair of the machinery. Heavy equipment operators are really skilled workers who are able to diagnose, troubleshoot and repair heavy machines in a work shop or on site. Mechanics have to be ready to transport their tools to a job site and carry out maintenance and repair in various conditions.

Sometimes it may be possible for delivery drivers to operate equipment with only a simple CDL. However, several jobs will need more particular training. Normally, the drivers operate with chaperone vehicles that are driven by trained drivers. These chaperone vehicles typically escort the delivery truck to its destination.
