They can be utilized in conjunction with cranes, platform lifts and other heavy duty machines as an appendage piece or to be used on their own. Pallet jacks are available in a variety of configurations from many firms who produce transport and stockroom devices. They can be loaned, or purchased used from used equipment retailers if a company does not need to invest in the cost of this equipment.

Pallet lifts are commonly configured with a set of forks, which can be employed to slide underneath a pallet, along with a bar to steady a pallet when being lifted. Certain kinds of pallet lifts have been given a hydraulic haul to be used to elevate and lower the pallet. Occasionally, lifts may be fixed with performance being accomplished by an overhead haul or by a tractor. Generally used in the on and offloading of vehicles, ships and trains, they can also systematize and rearrange warehouse supplies and moving materials around a warehouse.

If pallets contain valuable components or finished goods or they are very heavy, the handling of certain pallets can become a complex process. Sometimes it is required to receive worker training before operating a pallet lift or heavy equipment. Learning the right handling procedures, how to avoid danger signs such as an irregularly burdened pallet, or how to distinguish a broken pallet which might fail as a consequence of fatigue cracks or violent treatment is necessary for preserving a careful work atmosphere.

When in the marketplace to buy a pallet lift, it is vital to determine how the device will be utilized. In a plant where overhead hoists are presently fixed, a pallet jack attachment that functions with the current devices may be a prudent selection. If the facility has small aisles, choosing a pallet jack that will be maneuverable in the aisles and has a narrow profile may be the best choice.
